Baptisms Abound at Ascension Lutheran Church (Montreal, Quebec)

The Resurrection of our Lord / Easter Sunday was an especially blessed festival day this year at Ascension Lutheran Church in Montreal, Quebec, Canada. On Sunday, April 4th, 2010 eight people in all were Baptized into Christ and brought into the Kingdom of God.

Those Baptized were all of Chinese descent including five adults and three children. Since February God has brought eleven people in all to the saving waters of Holy Baptism at Ascension, including one child of Pakistani / Indian descent and 10 people in all of Chinese origin. We thank God for this wonderful work!

Ascension Lutheran Church is a multi-cultural congregation composed of people from many different nations from around the world including Slovakia, Pakistan, India, China the Philippines, Guyana, as well as other countries from the Caribbean, Europe, Asian, and Africa. The church is located in an equally ethnically diverse neighbourhood where the people are largely Muslim, Sikh, Hindu and non-Christian in general.

God has been using Ascension as a place to bring the Light of God's Word both to His people in the congregation and to the people in our midst who do not yet know Jesus Christ as Savior. Outreach activities over the past number of years have included an emphasis on teaching English as a Second Language (ESL). This is a service offered by the pastor and members of Ascension together. The ESL course consists of two weekly classes including an ESL Bible study where people of different religions come to our church to hear Bible stories and learn about Jesus Christ.

An exciting development thus far in 2010 is the growth of the Chinese Christian group which has been meeting regularly at Ascension. This group consists mainly of new Christians and those who are curious about the Christian faith. The number of those attending this group has steadily increased each week from fifteen in January to approximately forty at the present. The group has been holding Bible studies and will soon begin Service of the Word worship services. This group is lay-led by a member of Ascension, Hu Chun Lin, and is overseen by the Pastor of Ascension, Rev. David Godkin.

Hu Chun Lin is currently preparing to begin part-time studies for the Holy Ministry by distance education through the SMP program at Concordia Fort Wayne. Given the significant tuition costs of this program it is necessary to raise funds for this endeavour. STEWARDSHIP SOLUTIONS FOR OBESITY

OBESITY - A NATIONAL PROBLEM

Obesity was recently reported to be a national health problem. Not only are adults affected; over half the children in the U.S. are overweight. Video game addiction, coupled with excessive junk food and lack of exercise, have made many children "couch potatoes". The caloric content of some gourmet dishes featured on some TV cooking shows doesn't help matters any. Donna Simpson, a 602 lb. New Jersey woman, wants to become the "world's fattest woman". At 42, consuming 12,000 calories daily, she has set a goal to be 1,000 lbs. by 2012. In 2007, with the help of an extended medical team, she gave birth to a daughter, Too bad she won't live long enough to see her reach adulthood. Recent medical reports indicate obesity hinders health and hastens death.

HEDONISM

A CURRENT CULTURAL CURSE

I recently saw a bumper (bummer) sticker which stated: "Eat Well, Stay Fit and Die Anyway." The statement sounds like something Isaiah opposed when he condemned the people of his day for saying: "Let us eat and drink for tomorrow we die." (Isaiah 22:13). William G. Beymer put a humorous twist to it: "Eat, drink and be merry, for tomorrow ye diet." But humor still doesn't make wrong things right. An ancient Greek philosophy called "Cyreniac Egoistic Hedonism" espoused personal gratification of one's immediate desires.

Sounds like something prevalent in our current "post-modern" gluttonous culture reaping social economic and health havoc. The Latin writer

Cicero opposed Hedonism when he wrote, "Thou shouldst eat to live, not live to eat." Good advice!

CHRISTIAN STEWARDSHIP OF THE BODY

One of your greatest gifts from God is your body. He regards it as one of His precious possessions. He owns it by right of creation and redemption. (Ps. 100:3; 1 Cor. 6:19-20) He instructs us: "Therefore honor God with your body." (1 Cor. 6:20) Take care of your body and your body will care of you to God's honor and great delight. Be a good steward of your body for your own sake, the sake of others and, above all, for God's sake. Beware of the sin of gluttony!

GLUTTONY

The word "gluttony" comes from the Latin word, "gula", meaning "to consistently desire". Its antidote are the stewardship principles of temperance and moderation. Historically, gluttony has been listed as one of the "Seven Deadly Sins" (The others are wrath, greed, sloth, pride, lust, envy). Indeed, gluttony is deadly. It kills. The Scriptures warn us about it. "Put a knife to your throat if you are given to gluttony." (Prov. 23:2) "...a companion of gluttons disgraces his father." (Prov. 28:7b) "Do not join those who drink too much wine or gorge themselves on meat, for drunkards and gluttons become poor, and drowsiness clothes them in rags." (Prov. 23:20-21) When the enemies of Jesus wanted to accusingly insult Him, they called Him a glutton (Mt. 11:19)

CONTROL WEIGHT SENSIBLY

When trying to lose weight, don't foolishly fall for fads. The Federal Trade Commission warns against supplements, patches, creams, gadgets and harmful crash diets. Below are some sensible things to do to lose weight:

1. Pray
2. Eat when hungry
3. Reduce the amount of food intake
4. Reduce caloric content
5. Eat nourishing, quality food
6. Eat more often (but less in the long run)
7. Exercise
8. Engage a support group or system

Pastor Telloni (St. John LC) led our opening and closing devotions and Lectio Divina Bible study as well as our large group discussions. After the opening worship and ice breaker exercise, Pastor Cahill from Christ the King LC, introduced the topic and asked the group what is it to be Lutheran when you walk out the church door. The discussion centered around our heavenly Father and where we "rank" Him in our lives. Do we order our priorities like this: God first, spouse second, kids third, etc.? The point was that God isn't just "1st" in our life, He should be at the center



of all that we say and do. Of course we begin with God....we are his precious children! Our lives, and everything we hold dear, are to revolve around God's grace and mercy and love for us. The decisions we make each day, big and small, begin with God.... giving Him glory as we serve our neighbors, our families, our church. We all have a calling to serve one another. With Christ at the center, we can do just that! We live at the foot of the cross all the time because of our sin and our need for forgiveness. Is He at the center of everything we say and do?

SOME THINGS TO THINK ABOUT BEFORE SUMMER TRAVEL

1.) WHAT CAN HAPPEN WITHOUT A PERSONAL WILL:

- State law will determine who will inherit your estate.
- Your estate may experience full taxation under both federal and state laws.
- You will not be able to support your church or the ministries you love through your will. The government does not make charitable gifts!
- Your adult children with special needs may not be cared for in accordance with your wishes.

2.) MORE GOOD REASONS FOR A WILL:

- You can appoint the person who will manage and settle your estate.
- You can create trusts for a spouse, children, or others.
- You can make gifts of personal property and specific bequests to individuals.
- You may direct gifts to schools, churches, hospitals, or other charities.
- Estate taxes and settlement costs may often be reduced or eliminated with careful planning.

3.) WHAT ABOUT WRITING MY OWN WILL WITH AN ONLINE FORM?

- Using a generic form says “I am just like everyone else. One size fits all.”
- You are a unique individual, with a unique family, unique holdings, and unique wishes for disbursements.
- Unless you have a thorough knowledge of probate law, (and many attorneys do not even have this expertise!) you may be setting up your heirs for some difficult tax payment issues.
- There is nothing like the peace of mind and satisfaction of knowing that you did it right.

WHERE CAN I GET HELP?

The LCMS Foundation website offers a free “Wills Kit”. It doesn’t function like a generic form, but rather asks you the questions you need to have answered in order to create a good, functional, effective will. Go to www.lcmsfoundation.org. On the left sidebar, click “Gift Planning”. At the top right of the Gift Planning page, there is a click button for “Request Wills Kit”. You can have it sent to you by mail or email, or you can request assistance. Robin Paris is our SELC District Gift Planning Counselor. Her services are free for members of SELC District congregations. LWML DISTRICT CONVENTION TO BE HELD MAY 14-16, 2010

The SELC District of the Lutheran Women's Missionary League will hold its 12th Biennial Convention on May 14-16, 2010 at Zion Lutheran Church-Norridge, Illinois, and Concordia University Chicago in River Forest, Illinois. Each LWML Society will be represented by two delegates, but all the ladies of each society are encouraged to attend. This year's Convention theme is *As for Me and My House, We Will Serve the Lord*, Joshua 24:15. The women of the Western Zone of the SELC LWML are hosting this event.

The Convention will begin on Friday at Zion Lutheran Church-Norridge, Illinois, with registration at 3:00 p.m., a light supper at 5:30 p.m., and a Service with Holy Communion at 7:00 p.m. The Service will include a monetary ingathering for the Lutheran Haven. Empty computer print cartridges will also be collected at that time as a fund raiser for the upcoming LWML National Convention in Pittsburgh. Afterward, the group will gather at Concordia University Chicago, River Forest, Illinois where the remainder of the Convention will be held.

Highlights of the weekend Convention will include a Walk-a-Thon, a tour of Concordia University, and an optional tour of the nearby Frank Lloyd Wright Historic District. Bible Studies and Worship Services will focus on our Convention theme, and the Sunday morning Service will take place at the Concordia University Chicago Chapel on campus. On Saturday, business sessions will include a determination of the 2010-2012 Mission Grants, and the election of a full slate of officers for the District, including the President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, and Pastoral Counselor.

Two exceptional woman speakers will be featured at the Convention. Jan Struck, of Struck With Laughter Ministries, is often heard at LWML District and National events, leading Bible studies, workshops, and women's retreats. Jan, a noted humorist, will make a presentation at our Convention. Our second speaker will be Shari LeMonnier, a talented Christian artist and graduate of the Art Institute of Chicago.

Shari, who has done over 100 Biblical paintings, will be the featured speaker at the Saturday evening Convention Banquet, and will share her story of how she decided to serve the Lord through her art.

The registration fee for the Convention is \$100.00, which covers the registration, meals and banquet, and other necessary Convention expenses. Registration forms must be postmarked by April 10, 2010. A late registration fee of \$125.00 will be charged for registrations postmarked after April 10th. Late registrations must be postmarked by May 1, 2010, which is the final deadline for late registrations. Checks should be made payable to the SELC LWML Western Zone. Copies of the 2010 Convention Registration Packet have been emailed to each Pastor in the SELC District. In addition, Registration Packets have been mailed to each LWML society.

Convention goers will be housed on campus at Concordia University Chicago in air conditioned dorm rooms. The cost of a dormitory room is \$30.00 per person per night for a single room. The cost of a double dormitory room is \$50.00 per night total, which is \$25.00 per person per night for a double room. Husbands and wives attending the Convention will be housed in a separate area of the dormitory. Day registration for all day Saturday only is \$55.00 per person. The charge to attend only the banquet on Saturday evening is \$30.00. Room and meal registrations must accompany the other materials in the Registration Packet. Checks should be made out to SELC LWML Western Zone, and the same registration deadlines apply.
